Works are nearly complete on the Scarborough Spa Slope Stabilisation Scheme. The Esplanade was re-opened ahead of programme before Christmas and the cliff will be re-opened next month. Since the last newsletter, we have been busy placing the remaining topsoil and seed on the cliff, laying the remaining drainage, installing new street lighting, surfacing footpaths, finishing building walls, erecting new fencing and refitting benches on The Esplanade.

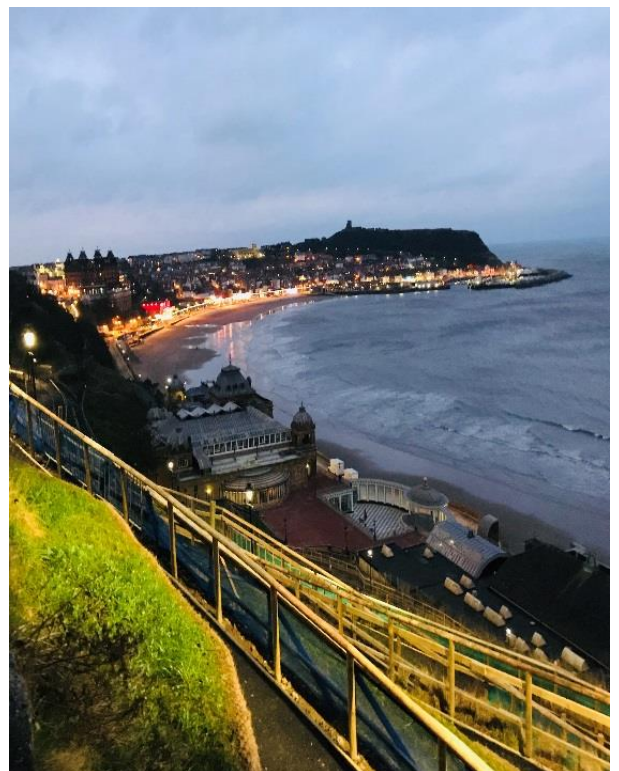
